BMI focuses on the academic and life issues of Black males ranging from retention to economic empowerment. We seek to utilize the diversity of cultural, political, and sociological perspectives that exists among African American men at Stillman College for the purposes of creating productive co-curricular activities for its participants.

GOALS of BMI

- * Increase the enrollment and matriculation of African American male students
- * Increase retention and graduation of African American male students
- * Provide strong Stillman Leadership on the challenges facing black youth and men
- * Strengthen the high school to college pipeline to enable many more African American male students to move into higher education
- * Improve teacher education to prepare professionals for urban education
- * Improve employment prospects for African American males
- * Contribute to the reduction of the incarceration rate for African American males

Participants are encouraged to utilize academic support resources including, Trio, the learning center, formal study groups as well attend BMI workshops and events. The Connection Network also will allow upperclassmen, faculty, and staff to assist participants in navigating academic and personal challenges.
